## Lea Green Cancellation

Unfortunately, we will not be able to take our Year 5 and 6 pupils on the planned residential trip to the Lea Green Outdoor Education Centre this summer. Originally, this was scheduled for the end of May. However, all scheduled residentials at the centre up until the end of June have now been cancelled.

Nevertheless, we are optimistic that we will be able to take our Year 5 and 6 pupils on a day visit to Lea Green to participate in a variety of outdoor activities that they would have been involved in during the planned residential. We are currently awaiting further information from Lea Green about the day visits and when or whether they can go ahead. We will inform you when we know more.

## Actions to take if your child tests positive for Covid-19 over the Easter break

Following on from recent information received from the DfE, the following are actions that you need to take if your child tests positive for Covid-19 during the Easter break period. This applies to any children that you have that currently attend Egginton Primary School.

If your child tests positive for Covid-19 during the first 6 days of the Easter break (up to and including 7<sup>th</sup> April) please can you email Mr Kitching directly at [headteacher@egginton.derbyshire.sch.uk](mailto:headteacher@egginton.derbyshire.sch.uk) and put in the subject line of the email 'Positive Covid-19 Case for (Your Child's name)'. In the email please give further details about the date and time that your child first started displaying symptoms of Covid-19 and any other information you have received from the NHS. It is essential that you do this as soon as you receive the positive test result.

The exact time that the Covid symptoms first developed is particularly important if they first started showing within 48 hours of your child last being in school as this will have an impact on which pupils and staff will be required to self-isolate (for example, if they first developed a high temperature at 8pm on Friday, 2<sup>nd</sup> April).

Mr Kitching will be checking his emails on a daily basis during the first six days and will get back to you as soon as he can to confirm that he has received your message.

Once notified of a positive case, Mr Kitching will contact the Public Health England team and follow the advice given to him. He will work with them to identify which pupils and staff have been in contact with the positive case during school hours and therefore will need to self-isolate in line with the current NHS guidelines.

If your child is identified as a contact that needs to self-isolate you will be informed in the first instance by text message and further information may follow on Parentmail or separately from NHS Test and Trace depending on the advice given by Public Health England.

If your child that attends school tests positive after the first six days of the Easter break, then you are not required to notify Mr Kitching straight away due to the length of time that will have passed since your child was in school. In this scenario you will need to follow the current NHS guidance that applies to the wider public. Current links for further information are below:
