School Sports Funding - What is it?

From April 2013, the Government has providing additional funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport in schools. Physical education will leave students with a legacy of success, facilitating a healthy and active lifestyle.

This Sports Premium funding will be ring fenced to be used for sport and PE, and schools will be able to determine what they believe to be the most appropriate use of this funding.

Funding will be allocated through a lump sum for each school and a per-pupil top-up mechanism.

Egginton Primary School received sports funding £16,548 in the 2022/23 academic year.

PE Vision Statement

At Egginton Primary School we value and celebrate the role of PE and sport has in the education, enjoyment and well-being of our pupils.

We ensure the provision is of high quality and allows all children to reach their full potential. We have benefitted by working in close partnership with external agencies 'Premier Education' and the South Derbyshire Active Sports Partnership during the 2023/24 academic year.

We provide continuous professional development (CPD) for staff involved in the delivery of PE and school sport, and work alongside clubs to provide strong links and effective pathways into activities outside of school.

All funding will be used to enhance and develop our PE and School Sport for all and in a way which is sustainable for the future.

Action	Impact
CPD/Training/Staffing	Most pupils have made expected progress in all areas of PE. Staff have had opportunities to develop skills and practice through observation of specialist coaches. Key Stage 2 teachers and teaching assistants have worked alongside Bikeability coaches to develop their knowledge and skills of teaching cycling and road safety. Year 5/6 pupils participated in a Bikeability course in Summer 2023.
Inter-school Sports competitions & Enrichment experiences	School have subsidised the provision of range of after school sports competitions for all year groups including transportation. The uptake has been positive with many pupils participating in competitions ranging from cricket and football in KS2 to Mini-Olympics activities in KS1 and EYFS. The Bikeability sessions proved to be very successful with many pupils becoming more confident when cycling on the road.
Resources and equipment	A variety of additional resources have been purchased to enhance PE lessons and after school clubs such as footballs, hula hoops and javelins. The playground markings have not been updated and this is no longer an option for sport premium funding in 2023/24.
Develop gardening area and use of local allotment to improve physical strength and a love of the outdoors	The allotment has completed its transformation and is now used regularly by the pupils as enrichment. Pupils have planted and harvested during the summer and autumn terms, enjoying the physical nature of being outdoors. The garden area is a proposed action for 2023/24.
Extra-curricular clubs and activities	School have subsidised the provision of range of after school sports clubs for all year groups. The uptake has been reasonably positive – however, we have decided to change providers for next year in order to offer a wider range of activities and engage even more pupils.
Additional Swimming sessions for Year Groups not in Y6	This has had high impact in terms of access to swimming lessons across the key stage. Y4, 5 and 6 have all had weekly lessons for two terms which we believe will improve the likelihood of all pupils being able to achieve the required standard in swimming by the end of Y6

Key Stage 2 Swimming Outcomes – 2022/23

We have a statutory duty to report our end of KS2 swimming outcomes for the pupils in our school. At the end of the 2022/23 academic year 80% of our pupils could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
