In April, we have learned about Kraftwerk, a German electronic band formed in Düsseldorf in 1970 by Ralf Hütter and Florian Schneider. Widely considered innovators and pioneers of electronic music, Kraftwerk were among the first successful acts to popularise the genre, fully embracing electronic instrumentation, including synthesizers, drum machines, and vocoders.
