### **School Wider Opening Update**

On Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> January the Prime Minister announced that schools would not be opening to further pupils immediately after the February Half term break. Instead, 8<sup>th</sup> March has been presented as the earliest possible opening date for more pupils. We anticipate receiving more information about this from the Department for Education in the week beginning 22<sup>nd</sup> February and you will be updated accordingly when we know more.

## Class Dojo

Thank you to all of parents and carers that continue to upload their child's remote learning work regularly to Class Dojo. We appreciate that Parents and Carers have very busy schedules and additional pressures at the moment. However, ideally staff would like to see the written work and photos of practical tasks that are completed by their child uploaded to Class Dojo on a daily basis rather than in bulk at the end of the week. This gives the opportunity for staff to view the completed tasks and offer feedback where appropriate whilst the completed work is still relatively fresh in the pupil's memory. With regards to the Oak Academy online lessons, please photograph and upload the written outcomes that your child completes from the lessons.

Not all pieces of work or photos uploaded to Class Dojo will receive a written comment from a member of staff. Nevertheless, they will all be viewed and will enable us to gain an insight into how the pupil is progressing during this period and help staff to assess and plan for next steps in learning.

#### **Microsoft Teams**

Both staff and pupils have really gained in confidence at using this platform over the last few weeks and it is proving to be a successful way of maintaining the classroom and school community as well as supporting learning. The staff are now timetabling a wide range of Teams sessions throughout the week including whole class lesson inputs, learning discussions and 'catch-ups', as well as small group and individual supported sessions. Wherever possible, please ensure your child attends any Teams meeting they are invited to in order to maximise their learning opportunities.

#### Children's Mental Health Week - 1st February to 7th February

Next week is Children's Mental Health week and we wanted to highlight the importance of this area, particularly during the current lockdown.
