School Sports Funding - what is it?

From April 2013, the Government has providing additional funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport in schools. Physical education will leave students with a legacy of success, facilitating a healthy and active lifestyle.

This Sports Premium funding will be ring fenced to be used for sport and PE, and schools will be able to determine what they believe to be the most appropriate use of this funding.

Funding will be allocated through a lump sum for each school and a per-pupil top-up mechanism. Egginton Primary School received £16,572 in funding during the 2021/22 academic year.

Egginton Primary School will be receiving sports funding £16,548 in the 2022/23 academic year.

PE Vision Statement

At Egginton Primary School we value and celebrate the role of PE and sport has in the education, enjoyment and well-being of our pupils.

We ensure the provision is of high quality and allows all children to reach their full potential. We have benefitted by working in close partnership with external agencies 'Sports Stars' and the South Derbyshire Active Sports Partnership during the 2022/23 academic year.

We provide continuous professional development (CPD) for staff involved in the delivery of PE and school sport, and work alongside clubs to provide strong links and effective pathways into activities outside of school.
