School Sports Funding. What is it?

From April 2013, the Government has providing additional funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport in schools. Physical education will leave students with a legacy of success, facilitating a healthy and active lifestyle.

This Sports Premium funding will be ring fenced to be used for sport and PE, and schools will be able to determine what they believe to be the most appropriate use of this funding.

Funding will be allocated through a lump sum for each school and a per-pupil top-up mechanism. Egginton Primary School received £16600 in funding during the 2020/21 academic year.

Egginton Primary School will be receiving sports funding £16,613 in the 2021/22 academic year.

PE Vision Statement

At Egginton Primary School we value and celebrate the role of PE and sport has in the education, enjoyment and well-being of our pupils.

We ensure the provision is of high quality and allows all children to reach their full potential. We have benefitted by working in close partnership with external agencies 'Sports Stars' and the South Derbyshire Active Sports Partnership during the 2021/22 academic year.

We provide continuous professional development (CPD) for staff involved in the delivery of PE and school sport, and work alongside clubs to provide strong links and effective pathways into activities outside of school.

PE development through funding 2020/21

Budget received: £16700

N.B. Due to the restrictions placed by the Covid Pandemic, it was not possible to carry out all planned actions to their full extent in the 20/21 academic year.

Action	Impact
High quality PE sessions taught by specialist coaches	Majority of pupils have made good progress in areas of PE. Staff have had opportunities to develop skills and practice through observation of specialist coaches.
Extra-curricular clubs	School have subsidised the provision of range of after school sports clubs for all year groups. The uptake has been

	positive with the majority of pupils participating in an after school club.
Sports competitions	Funding has enabled us to participate in some online inter-school sports competitions including archery and athletics. For a small school, this competitive experience was extremely valuable for our pupils.
Additional Swimming sessions for Years	We had planned to use additional funding to send all pupils in Year 4 and Year 5 Swimming in addition to Year 6. However, due to the restrictions placed by the pandemic, we were not able to take our pupils swimming in the 20/21 academic year. This action has been carried forward to the next academic year.
Equipment	A number of PE equipment purchases have been made to update resources and ensure resource provision is appropriate. We have also invested in our outdoor play equipment improve provision and opportunities for pupils during break and lunch times,
Staff training/ CPD	Teaching Assistants and teachers have worked alongside external Sports Stars Coaches to develop knowledge and skills of delivering a sequence of PE lessons in range of different sports areas. Key Stage 2 teachers and teaching assistants have worked alongside Bikeability coaches to develop their knowledge and skills of teaching cycling and road safety. Year 6 pupils participated in a Bikability course in Summer 2021.
Inclusion for SEN pupils	Funding has enabled us to put additional support and arrangements in place to enable some pupils with SEN to access sport and outdoor learning activities that they would not normally be able to do so. This has included: -Funding additional physical space as break out areas for pupils with additional sensory needs - Additional TA support for SEN pupils in PE lessons. -Funding transport to provide SEN pupils with the means to attend and therefore access outdoor educational provision
Enhancing Outdoor Provision for EYFS to develop Gross and Fine Motor Skills	We have purchased additional physical resources to enhance this area of the EYFS curriculum. Additional TA adult support has led targeted group sessions to develop these areas, particularly in Physical Development. Our outcomes for Physical Development and Literacy have improved this year.

PE funding 2021/22

Budget £16,613 proposed expenditure:

Area	Cost	Proposed Action
CPD/Training/Staffing	£3000 approx.	Specialist coaches to deliver PE sessions alongside staff to enhance CPD sessions. Developing the skills of staff to lead areas of PE and Healthy lifestyles. Lunch time play leaders appointed to lead and coordinate active games during lunch time sessions.
Inter-school Sports competitions	£2500 approx.	Wide involvement at inter-school events. Sports Premium to cover cost of staff attending sessions and transport to and from sessions. It also covers membership cost with the South Derbyshire Active Partnership/
Resources and equipment	£500 approx.	Purchase and replenishment of PE resources to ensure high quality resources for lessons
Extra-curricular clubs and activities	£2000 approx.	Premium to subsidise cost of a wide variety of sports clubs to cater to different interests.
Enrichment experiences	£1000 approx.	Themed days/sessions to provide pupils with the opportunity to experience more sports and healthy activities they have not participated in before. Bikeability sessions for Year 5 and 6 pupils.
Inclusion of SEN pupils	£3000	Additional TA support in lessons for some pupils with SEN to help further enable them to access the PE curriculum.
Enhancing Physical Development in the EYFS curriculum	£2000	Additional targeted TA/Teacher led sessions for EYFS pupils to enhance Physical Development in EYFS
Additional Swimming sessions for Year Groups not in Y6	£2000	Year 5 and 4 to attend Swimming sessions in Spring and Summer terms. Funding to cover transport, use of facilities and swimming instructor/ staff costs.

All funding will be used to enhance and develop our PE and School Sport for all and in a way which is sustainable for the future.

Key Stage 2 Swimming Outcomes – 2019/20

We have a statutory duty to report our end of KS2 swimming outcomes for the pupils in our school.

At the end of the 2019/20 academic year 100% (12/12) of our pupils achieved the required standard in swimming and water safety.

N.B. Due to the restrictions placed by the Covid pandemic, swimming did not take place in the 20/21 academic year.
