## Covid-19 Update

Covid-19 cases remain high in the South Derbyshire area and we ask that parents and carers continue to work with us to help reduce the spread of the virus as much as possible in order to stop people falling ill as well as causing disruption to learning.

A reminder that if your child has any of the 3 main Covid-19 symptoms, please do not send them into school. Please book a **PCR test** as soon as possible and only bring them back to school if this is recorded as negative.

The three main symptoms as identified by the NHS are:

- A new, continuous cough
- A loss or change in taste or smell
- A high temperature

Also, if you are identified as a close contact by NHS Test and Trace, please book a PCR test as soon as possible.
